The Samaritan Woman

In today's Gospel, Jesus, weary from his travels, seeks rest at the local well in the town of Sichar. It is here that He goes against the accepted social and political norm of His time. He engages in conversation with a woman! The Samaritans were a mixed race, and were fierce enemies of the Jews. The Samaritan woman listened intently to our Lord's explanation of "living water." Jesus said, "Whoever drinks the water that I shall give him will never thirst." According to Sacred Tradition, she is later baptized into Christianity and given the name Photini, meaning "the enlightened one." During Nero's reign, she was martyred by being thrown into a well.
